Legal Information

Obtaining a Legal Name Change

The costs associated with obtaining a legal name change in Georgia can run up to \$300 if you use an attorney. However, there are resources available in the Atlanta community that can assist you in obtaining a name change with little to no costs. You can also visit www.atlantagender.org for the necessary documents. The process takes approximately 4-6 weeks.

New Birth Certificate & Drivers License

In the state of Georgia, the law states that a birth certificate shall be amended, "Upon receipt of a certified copy of a court order indicating the sex of an individual born in this state has been changed by surgical procedure and that such individual's name has been changed." Please contact Vital Records Service of Atlanta (404) 656-4901 and ask for information about correcting a vital record. According to the Georgia DDS, "A person may have the gender designation on their driver's license change after a gender reassignment operation upon the presentation to a driver examiner of either a court order reflecting such change, or a physician's letter certifying such change." Reporting a Bias Incident

Name Changes

All legal and preferred name changes can be submitted to the Registrar by completing a Name Change Form and attaching supporting documents, if any. Legal name changes will be processed immediately but preferred name changes will only be processed three times a year (Fall break, Winter break and Spring break). Students should bring a copy of their Name Change Form to Walters G-4 to obtain a new student ID. OPD is updated shortly after the Registrar's Office has changed the student record. Wellness Center

The Wellness Center, located on the 1st floor of Hopkins Hall, provides safe, confidential and supportive counseling and health services. For students who are concerned about their privacy in seeking therapy or counseling, the Wellness Center lobby is arranged so that students do not know if someone is there for a medical appointment, massage, or for counseling. For students who prefer the added privacy of seeing someone off campus, a referral can be provided to a counselor in the community at no charge to the student.
