

As of April 31, 2012, 578 black gay youth, under the age of 25, from across the United States have taken the national needs assessment via survey monkey, through our partner organizations on the national level and though our local community centers and programs that serve black gay youth.

This publication is simply designed to give a snapshot of data collected as we head towards our goal of 2,500 youth completing the needs assessment by the end of 2012, detailing what it is like to grow up black and gay in America. All questions from the survey are not in this publication; however they will be included in the final, detailed, state by state report and national report.

The National Strategy will also be presented at several national conferences including the Allied Media Conference in Detroit, MI, the Gay men's Health Summit in Washington, D.C. and the National LGBT Health Equity Summit in Kansas City, MO

Brief summary





AVERAGE AGE:

The average age of respondents to the survey was 19.6, with the youngest of the 578 being 12 and the oldest selecting an age of 25.

The majority of respondents took the survey at a local youth center who signed on to support the project (65%) with the remaining taking the survey online.


All respondents entered contact info to start the needs assessments. This will be used for additional assessments for black lesbians, bisexual and transgendered youth.



Most questions on the survey provided fixed answers, however there were a few questions that allowed youth to enter data/answers themselves:

WHAT THINGS WOULD MAKE YOUR LIFE BEARABLE AS A BLACK GAY YOUTH LIVING IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA?

Acceptance	90% of respondents listed this item
Love/Respect	70%
Financial Security	70%
EMPLOYMENT	60%
More Social Services	60%
Youth Events (For Under 21)	50%
GAY RIGHTS	45%
RACE RELATED ISSUES	40%
